ADMISSIONS POLICY

(reviewed November 2018)

Entrance Qualifications

A personal interview with one of the Institute's Program Directors, or a suitably qualified person requested to do so by a Program Director, is necessary prior to acceptance. The Institute admits as enrolled students:

- Applicants who have had experience working with children preferably in a Waldorf setting.
- Applicants with some post secondary education, for example a University or College degree or a Provincial Teaching Certificate.
- Applicants who have completed and submitted the 'West Coast Institute Waldorf Grades Teacher Training' application for admission.
- Applicants who have submitted brief biography and resumé.
- Applicants who have returned a note from a licensed physician which certifies that the applicant is in good health, free from communicable disease, including TB, and fit to undertake training.
- Applicants who have paid \$100 non-refundable application processing fee along with the application for admission, payable to 'West Coast Institute'.
- Applicants who have submitted a copy of a current BC Teaching Certificate or a criminal record check provided by the local police department. Any charges involved must be borne by the applicant.
- Applicants whose previous debts to the West Coast Institute have been settled prior to admission.

NOTE

If an applicant wishes to teach as a lead teacher in a Waldorf Grades classroom in British Columbia, she/he must possess a British Columbia Teaching Certificate or a Teaching Certificate issued by the Independent Schools in British Columbia. An individual can work as an Assistant in a Waldorf Grades classroom in B.C. if they are in the process of completing the British Columbia Teachers Certificate Program or the requirements for an Independent Schools Teaching Certificate.
